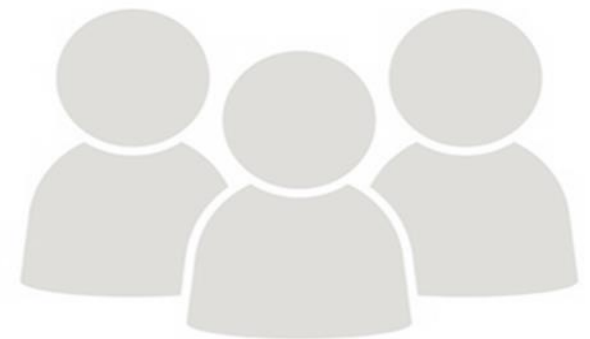

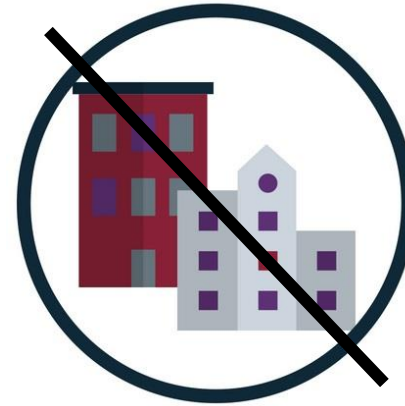

Offer community integration and bring community groups into the Centers



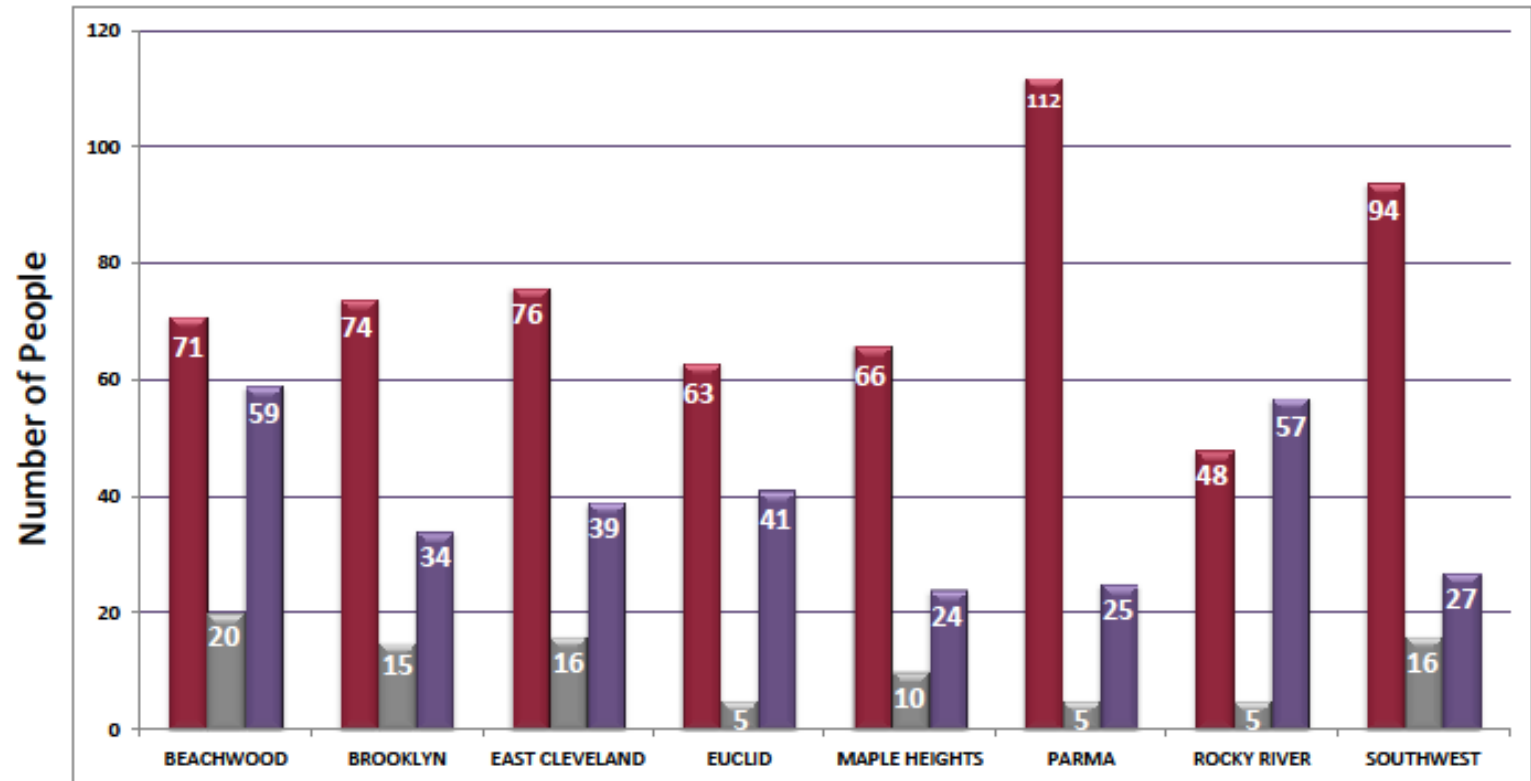
Do you plan to stay at the AAC once it transitions to a private provider?

Be a for-profit corporation, non-profit corporation, limited liability company or limited liability partnership

Have an employer identification number

Have comprehensive general liability insurance

Have a proven system to ensure compliance with all requirements

Employ a CEO and at least one employee
